
Sanitation Update

Minutes

May 13, 2010

The regular meeting of the City Commission was called to order at 7:30 PM on May 13, 2010 at the meeting room of the Hurstbourne Acres City Hall/Police Department, 1940 S Hurstbourne Parkway, Louisville, Kentucky, with the following persons present:

Minutes for Meeting on April 8, 2010

Commissioner Lynch made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hardin and passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report

John Price read the treasurer's report for April, 2010 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Lynch then made a motion to approve as read, which was seconded by Commissioner Renninger. The motion passed without opposition.

Warrants

The warrants for April, 2010 were then read by John Price and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Lynch made a motion to approve payment of the warrants, which was seconded by Commissioner Renninger and passed unanimously.

Attorney's Report

In Steve Emery's absence, Attorney T. Andrew Howell reported that all of the remaining outstanding property taxes have been collected. There was nothing else about which to report.

Police Report

Police Chief Chris Redman reported as follows:
-423 police hours from 4/8/10 to 5/13/10,
-5 citations, 2 arrests,
-8 criminal reports (Burglary to Robbery),
-5 motorist assists,
-17 traffic stops,
-16 suspicious persons,

-345 police & public contacts,
-1 ongoing investigation with an outside agency.

In other news, the 'Click it or Ticket' grant/campaign begins 5/26 and runs through June. Speeders and seat belt violators will be targeted. The city is currently working on a grant for new police equipment.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Police

In Commissioner Dunn's absence, there was nothing about which to report.

Roads and Lighting

Commissioner Lynch reported that the sink hole adjacent to his property will be repaired by MSD soon. Some street lights out in the city need replacing; leveling of a portion of the median on Bunsen Way will need to be done at some point; street sign on Blowing Tree stolen with a recommendation to use an iron post and welded sign as a more permanent solution, and the Block Watch signs for the apartment complexes have been ordered.

Parks Commissioner

Commissioner Hardin advised that donations from a few residents in the city helped pay for installing trees in the park. There is a new park sign and new flowers/landscaping around the sign. Regarding the electrical service and lighting proposed for the park, two bids were obtained, both about \$2,400. Both of the residents on either side of the park entrance were contacted and were in favor of the plans.

Sanitation

Commissioner Renninger reported that 10 residents replied to the newsletter outlining the three options for the upcoming sanitation contract. After further consideration, garbage pickup will remain at twice a week with recycling pickup changed to every other week. Generally, those residents who currently recycle will be provided with a new 65-gallon recycle bin automatically. However, any resident interested in recycling can request the new bin. Backdoor service for garbage pickup will continue.

In other news, on Friday, 5/14/10, Commissioner Renninger will be talking to the residents at the East Chase Apartments to help setup the Block Watch program there.

OLD BUSINESS

2nd Reading of Ad Valorem Tax Ordinance

Commissioner Lynch made a motion to have the 2nd reading of Ordinance #1, Series 2010, establishing the property tax rate at \$.14/per \$100 of valuation for the fiscal year beginning 7/1/10. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hardin which passed unopposed. Mayor Fore then completed the reading. The ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and publication.

2nd Reading of Budget Ordinance

After further discussion of the proposed budget, Commissioner Hardin made a motion to have the 2nd reading of Ordinance #2, Series 2010, establishing the budget for the fiscal year beginning 7/1/10. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger which passed unanimously. The reading was then completed by Mayor Fore. The ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and publication.

City Hall Proposal Update

The decision by the Jefferson County Board of Education to offer sale of the land behind the Kennedy School to Hurstbourne Acres should be forthcoming within a few days. This land is the preferred location for any future City Hall/Police Station.

City-wide Yard Sale

The city-wide yard sale will be held on Saturday, June 12, 2010 with official hours between 8:00 am and 2:00 pm. Appropriate signs including 'no parking' signs will be posted.

There being no further business or discussion, the meeting was adjourned.
