## Minutes

June 10, 2010

The regular meeting of the City Commission was called to order at 7:30 pm on June 10, 2010 at the meeting room of the Hurstbourne Acres City Hall/Police Department, 1940 S. Hurstbourne Parkway, Louisville, Kentucky, with the following persons present:

### Presentation to HA Police Department

In recognition of going above and beyond the standard accreditation, Kentucky League of Cities representative, Mark Filburn, presented to the Hurstbourne Acres City Police Department the 'Governor's Proclamation' tribute. This same presentation will be made at the upcoming State KLC Conference.

### Minutes for Meeting on May 13, 2010

Commissioner Dunn made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lynch, and passed unanimously.

### Treasurer's Report

John Price read the treasurer's report for May, 2010 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Dunn then made a motion to approve as read, which was seconded by Commissioner Lynch. The motion passed without opposition.

### Warrants

The warrants for May, 2010 were then read by John Price, and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Dunn made a motion to approve payment of the warrants, which was seconded by Commissioner Lynch and passed with Commissioner Hardin abstaining on Warrant #396. After discussion about the ditch that runs along Hurstbourne Parkway, Commissioners Hardin and Lynch, along with Police Chief Redman, will make the appropriate contacts about getting it cleaned out.

Mayor Fore also asked Metro Council Representative to assist with having the State fulfill its obligation concerning the clean out.

### Sidewalk Along Hurstbourne Parkway

Mayor Fore presented the idea of a sidewalk on Hurstbourne Parkway. It would run from the dentist's office on Hurstbourne Lane to Bunsen Way. Metro Council Representative Jon Ackerson outlined the issues involved including the cost of obtaining a 'Right of Way'. His office will review the idea further.

### Attorney's Report

Attorney Steve Emery had nothing new about which to report.

### Police Report

Police Chief Chris Redman reported as follows:

- 286 police hours from 5/13/10 to 6/10/10,
- 18 hours of 'Click It or Ticket' grant time,
- 19 citations,
- 2 arrests,
- 6 criminal reports,
- 1 accident (motorcyclist, resulting in fatality),
- 32 traffic stops,
- 4 motorist assists,
- 11 suspicious persons,
- 2 investigations with outside agencies,

In other news, the city is currently working on three grants for new police equipment. As mentioned earlier in the meeting, the 'Governor's Proclamation' was presented to the city. Finally, Commissioner Dunn made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Lynch, to enact Resolution #1, Series 2010, authorizing the Mayor to make application, and upon approval, to enter into an agreement with the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security to execute and furnish all required documentation as required. The motion passed unopposed, and the reading was completed by Mayor Fore.

## COMMITTEE REPORTS

### Police

Commissioner Dunn talked about the proposed grants for obtaining new police equipment.

### Roads and Lighting

Commissioner Lynch reported that the new Blowing Tree sign has been ordered. In other news, the sink hole next to Commissioner Lynch's property has still not been repaired by MSD.

### Parks Commissioner

Commissioner Hardin advised that a problem had arisen about the installation of the electrical service in the park. It will be about another two weeks before it's resolved. It was also mentioned that the trash bins in the park are not being emptied. Rumpke will be contacted. The grass cutting of the park and retention basin is proceeding, although it was noted by one of the residents of Hurstbourne Circle that the strip of land behind the houses is being overlooked. Finally, the

signs are up for the citywide yard sale on Saturday, 6/12/10.

### **Sanitation**

Commissioner Renninger advised of a correction needed to the trash pickup schedule published in the Hurstbourne Acres Post. It should have said, 'twice weekly trash pickup on Tuesdays and Fridays', not Tuesdays and Thursdays. Regarding the new recycle bins, all households will be getting one without the need to make a request.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### **1st Reading of Ordinance #3**

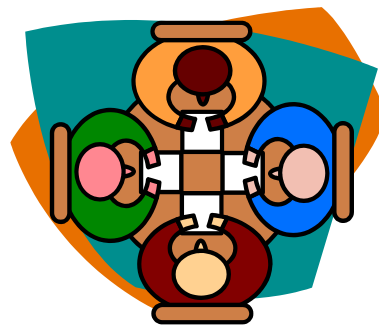
Commissioner Dunn made a motion to have the 1st reading of Ordinance #3, Series 2010, establishing a new pay scale for non-elected offices (Police Chief & Police Sergeant). The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger and passed unanimously. The reading was then completed by Mayor Fore. It was noted that a special meeting will be held on June 22 at 7:30 pm to have the second reading.

#### **1st Reading of Ordinance #4**

After concerns were expressed and discussed about the proposed raises, Commissioner Dunn made a motion to have the 1st reading of Ordinance #4, Series 2010, establishing the new pay scale for non-elected officials (City Treasurer & City Clerk). The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger which passed unanimously. Mayor Fore then read the ordinance. It was noted that a special meeting will be held on June 22 at 7:30 pm to have the second reading.

There being no further business or discussion, the meeting was adjourned.
