Introduction of Police Officer Bittle

Mayor Fore introduced Police Officer Rusty Bittle, who the city has hired to fill in when Police Chief Redman or Sergeant Skaggs is unavailable.

Minutes for Meeting on June 11, 2010

Commissioner Dunn made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lynch and passed unanimously.

Minutes for Special Meeting of June 22, 2010

Commissioner Dunn made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lynch and passed unopposed.

Treasurer's Report

John Price read the treasurer's report for June, 2010 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Dunn then made a motion to approve as read, which was seconded by Commissioner Lynch. The motion passed without opposition.

Warrants

The warrants for June, 2010 were then read by John Price, and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Dunn made a motion to approve payment of the warrants, which was seconded by Commissioner Renninger and passed unopposed.

Attorney's Report

Attorney Steve Emery had nothing new about which to report.

Police Report

Police Chief Chris Redman reported as follows:

- 456 police hours from 6/10/10 to 7/22/10,
- 4 citations, 1 arrest,
- 18 criminal reports (Burglary to Robbery),
- 11 traffic stops,

In other news, Police Chief Redman & Commissioner Renninger finished work on a grant, and the city is waiting on the camera for the police vehicle. It was also mentioned that Chief Redman will be in class in Bowling Green from 8/9/10 to 8/12/10. Finally, the

Police Department received another award, this time for assisting with the reburial of 32 veterans.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Police

Commissioner Dunn provided an explanation for some Police expenses, but otherwise had nothing new to report.

Roads and Lighting

Commissioner Lynch reported on the following:

- LG&E contacted about a leaning light on Cardwell Way,
- 3 lights on Bristol Ave have been fixed,
- the new street sign for Wesley & Blowing Tree has not yet been received,
- the sink hole on Hurstbourne Circle next to Commissioner Lynch's property has been repaired,
- the 'Do Not Block Intersection' sign has not been installed, so Commissioner Lynch said he would handle,
- other signs still need to be installed such as for the Block Watch,
- reflectors have been installed along Blowing Tree.

Parks Commissioner

Commissioner Hardin's report included the following:

- Retention Basin has been cleaned out,
- the ditch in front of Nunnlea down to Old Hurstbourne Lane has been cleaned up,
- electrical for the park will hopefully be hooked up this week,
- playground equipment has been repaired, the sand cleaned out, and new trees planted,
- grass cutting in the park and retention basin is being performed as scheduled,
- Port-A-Let in the park is being cleaned every Tuesday,
- Commissioner Hardin received thanks for the work involving the cleanout of the retention basin, ditch in front of Nunnlea, repair of the playground equipment, and improvement of the park sign,
- Finally, it was noted that the city picnic will be on 9/19/10 with plans well underway or completed.

Sanitation

Commissioner Renninger advised of a backdoor service problem stemming from a misunderstanding. If a resident uses one of the large wheeled bins provided by Rumpke, the expectation is that the resident will have it moved to the curb themselves. There is no backdoor service for this dumpster. In other news, there have been some complaints about missed pickups. Finally, as a reminder, only the large recycle bins can now be used.

OLD BUSINESS

Yard Sale

Based on reports from residents and the Police Department, the yard sale was a success with no problems noted.

Report on Proposed New City Hall/Police Dept.

Commissioner Hardin provided an update on the proposed plans for the new City Hall & Police Department. After outlining the completed proposal for the purchase of the land behind Kennedy School from the Jefferson County School Board, there was considerable discussion. Eventually, it was agreed to postpone further discussion and the decision until next month's meeting on 8/19/10. This postponement was designed to allow the Mayor, Commissioners and Police Chief to personally canvas the city for residents' opinions. Mayor Fore will develop the format to be presented to the residents and businesses in our city. The preliminary assignments are as follows:

Commissioner Dunn--Cardwell Way, Blowing Tree, and the Apartments,

Commissioner Renninger--Wesley, Haviland & Hoke,

Commissioner Lynch--Hurstbourne Circle, Hurstbourne Lane, & Taylorsville Rd,

Mayor Fore--Bristol, Addington, & Woodfield, Police Chief Redman--all businesses.

There being no further business or discussion, the meeting was adjourned.
