### LAST LEAF PICKUP

December 4, 5, 6 (Sat/Sun/Mon)

Please have your leaves raked to within three ft. of the road--no sticks, twigs or garbage.

The "Speed Bump" sign on Blowing Tree was damaged by vandals. There is a two hundred dollar reward for arrest and conviction of the culprits responsible for the damage to city property.

In the first week of November I was asked to contact an LG&E representative if the City wanted to continue electrical service to the entrance sign at Cardwell Way. I found out that in 1994 when the lighting was installed the monthly statement went to the City of Hurstbourne for some unknown reason. Recently an energy audit by the City of Hurstbourne discovered this by their City Manager. I retrieved the meter number for the lighted sign at Hurstbourne Lane because I believed it was installed at the same time and found that again the City of Hurstbourne was paying for it also. Nobody is happy with this situation. There are two locations x 12 months x 16 years. This is a lot of money. LG&E records are only kept for 24 months and they have sent statements for that period to us. But there are still 14 years to work out. I conducted an energy audit of Hurstbourne Acres' light poles. I counted them and also had Chief Redman count them. I believe there are seven poles that we are paying for that I can't find. A site map for pole locations has been requested from LG&E to determine what is wrong and where the lights are located. I hope to have more news by meeting night.

In other news, it was noted that the Police Computers are now on line in the police cars. Commissioner Lynch mentioned a particular case of speeding in the city. As it was agreed that speeders continue to be a problem, Sergeant Skaggs said that this would be handled.

#### Attorney's Report

Other than the research mentioned earlier in the meeting about the deed restrictions for the 3 apartment complexes, Steve Emery advised that he has prepared a draft for the requested ordinance to prohibit the consumption of alcohol in the city park.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS

##### Police

In Commissioner Dunn's absence, there was nothing new about which to report.

##### Roads and Lighting

Commissioner Lynch advised that we are still working on getting the light repaired at the city entrance sign on Hurstbourne Lane. In other news, it was noted that lights on several poles throughout the city are malfunctioning. The lights are burning during the day. These can be reported directly to LG&E.

##### Parks Commissioner

Commissioner Hardin reported that the Port-A-Let in the park has been removed for the winter. Also, he confirmed that new bushes have been planted in the park replacing the damaged ones.

##### Sanitation

Commissioner Renninger advised that there have been complaints about dumpster pickup after 10:00 pm at the buildings on Bunsen Way. She noted that this is not Rumpke, and that apparently those drivers have not been made aware of the city ordinance. In other news, recycling is going well, and the pickup dates are noted in the city newsletter.

#### OLD BUSINESS

##### Leaf Removal

The next leaf pickup is scheduled for this weekend, November 13, 14, & 15 (Sat/Sun/Mon). As a reminder, residents should make sure the leaves are raked up to the road.

##### Grant Update

Commissioner Renninger confirmed that Sergeant Skaggs & she went to a meeting on November 5th. Of the 252 grant applications received from cities all over Kentucky, 142 were approved, and 2 of those were awarded to Hurstbourne Acres.

##### Election Results

After thanking everyone for the great turnout for the Campaign Forum, Acting Mayor Teresa Renninger outlined the elections results. Mayor Fore retains his position as Mayor, Commissioner Renninger & Hardin also retain their positions as Commissioner, and the 2 new Commissioners beginning January 1, 2011 will be Sally Price & Dan Kuster.
