The regular meeting of the City Commission was called to order at 7:30 PM on April 12, 2011 at the meeting room of the Hurstbourne Acres City Hall/Police Department, 1940 S Hurstbourne Parkway, Louisville, Kentucky, with the following persons present:

Introduction of New Treasurer

Mayor Fore introduced the new city Treasurer, Sharon Hollkamp. As indicated at last month's meeting, John Price had resigned his position requiring the city to find a replacement.

Letter from Home of the Innocence

A letter of thanks from the Home of the Innocence was read by Mayor Fore. Our city had donated 6 gift bags from the Easter Egg Hunt.

Minutes for Meeting on April 14, 2011

Commissioner Hardin made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was then seconded by Commissioner Renninger, and passed without opposition.

Treasurer's Report

Sharon Hollkamp read the treasurer's report for April 2011. Copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Renninger made a motion to approve as read, which was seconded by Commissioner Price. The motion passed without opposition.

Warrants

The warrants for April 2011 were then read by Sharon Hollkamp. Copies were made available for all people in attendance. After discussion, Commissioner Renninger made a motion to approve the warrants as read. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price which passed unopposed.

Police Report

Police Chief Redman reported on the following:

- 391 coverage hours from 4/14/11 to 5/12/11
- 265 Police/Public interactions
- 2 arrests
- 3 traffic citations
- 7 traffic stops
- 11 dispatched runs (ranging from domestic violence to traffic accidents)
- 9 motorists assists
- housewatches and businesses checks performed
- 13 suspicious persons/vehicles
- 7 assists of outside agencies,

In other news, the new radios are now online. The "Click it or Ticket" program starts May 25th and runs through June 3rd. Hurstbourne Acres Police Department will participate with the State & Local Law Enforcement to target traffic offenders in the Hurstbourne Acres area.

The Prescription Drug Drop-Off program was again a success. 59 pounds of prescription drugs were turned over to the DEA.

Attorney's Report

City Attorney John Frith Stewart provided Mayor Fore with a copy of Ordinance #7, Series 2011, an ordinance adopting the codification of all ordinances for the City of Hurstbourne Acres, Kentucky. The first reading of the ordinance was then completed. For the record, the current book of ordinances, including a CD, along with the book of ordinances, which were replaced or no longer applicable, were delivered to the city clerk. Mayor Fore then authorized & mandated the reproduction of the CD for distribution to each city Commissioner. Commissioner Kuster then asked Attorney Stewart if he was able to determine the legality of giving Christmas bonuses to city employees as was mentioned at last month's meeting. Attorney Stewart advised that he would have an answer by tomorrow, May 13th.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parks & Recreation

Commissioner Kuster advised that there has been no new graffiti in the park since the last report. Regarding the landscaping around all 3 city signs and the flagpole, he has obtained another bid in addition to the one from Stump Busters. Currently, the cost of the landscaping is going to be about \$3100. An amount for the cleanup around the trees on Bunsen and behind Hurstbourne Circle has not yet been determined.

Sanitation

Commissioner Price reported a resident on Addington had requested and received a new, smaller garbage can from Rumpke. In addition to the 95-gallon size that most residents use, a 65-gallon can is also available. In other news, the grant applied for at Operation Brightside has been denied. Concerning applications for matching grants, Commissioner Price again made a motion that no one can apply for a matching grant without first obtaining prior approval from the entire Commission. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Kuster. After discussion, a roll call vote was requested for the record. Commissioners Price and Kuster voted "yes" and Commissioners Hardin & Renninger voted "no" leaving the deciding vote with Mayor Fore, who voted "no". Therefore, the motion did not pass. Commissioner Price

provided an update to the idea of joining in a contract with adjoining cities for trash pickup service. To help the city make a decision, Mayor Fore asked that Michael Sweeten from Rumpke be invited to next month's meeting for questions and further discussion.

Sanitation & Lights

Commissioner Hardin advised that in lieu of a new street sign on Blowing Tree, the existing post has been painted with the street name from 2 different sides. If it is decided later to again install a street sign similar to the rest of the street signs in the city, that can be done. Concerning a lamp post on Hurstbourne Lane that had been damaged by wind, it has since been repaired. A sign on the corner of Haviland and Addington has been fixed temporarily. In a question about another damaged light post from recent storms, Mayor Fore confirmed that he both e-mailed and called LG&E and has the globe part in his garage.

Police

Commissioner Renninger reported May 15th through May 21st is National Police Week. This week is designed to honor those who currently serve, those who have lost their lives in service to us, and the survivors of those who have lost their lives while serving. In other news, we have received our Safety Grant notification from the Kentucky League of Cities which is a matching grant. Items have already been purchased and this is notification of the amounts for which we will be reimbursed (75% for the in-car cameras, 50% for the light bar on police vehicle, and 50% for the safety vests). As noted earlier by Police Chief Redman, the drug drop-off program went well. From the "Ticket Fund", we have learned that our city has received a total of \$55,720.58 for the period from September 2006 through October 2010. Another amount that totals over \$12,000 has been distributed in error to another city, into which we are currently checking.

To honor a campaign promise to help the elderly in our city, both Commissioner Renninger and Police Chief Redman are working on a program to identify those members of our city who suffer from dementia and similar diseases. Documentation, including photos, will be available for police agencies to assist

them in finding residents who have wandered from their homes to get them back safely.

Finally, it was noted that there are 4 outstanding grants: 1. The Safety Grant from KY league of cities, for which all documentation has been sent in and we are awaiting the check. 2. Homeland Security Grant #1 is for MDTs (in-car computers). All equipment has been purchased and received and documentation has been put together. We are now waiting for the canceled check so we can submit for repayment. 3. Homeland Security Grant #2 is for a new radio system. The equipment has been purchased and received and documentation has been put together. We are waiting for the canceled check so we can submit for repayment. Both Homeland Security Grants paid 100% of the purchase price. 4. The final grant deals with the "Click it or Ticket" money. This is overtime money for our PD to participate in the program for which we are reimbursed 100%.

OLD BUSINESS

2nd Reading of Ordinance #5, Series 2011

After discussion, Mayor Fore completed the second reading of Ordinance #5, Series 2011, establishing the Ad Valorem property tax for the upcoming fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011. Commissioner Kuster made a motion to enact and ordain as read. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price, and passed without opposition. It will become effective upon its publication.

2nd Reading of Ordinance #6, Series 2011

After discussion and some adjustments, Mayor Fore completed the second reading of Ordinance #6, Series 2011 establishing the city budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011. Commissioner Renninger made a motion to enact and ordain as read. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price which passed unopposed. The ordinance will become effective upon its publication.

Miscellaneous

Mayor Fore mentioned that a Chick-Fil-A will be replacing the old Taco Bueno that was located in front of Home Depot. Commissioner Price made a motion that the Mayor, Commissioners and all city employees be paid at the end of the pay period

instead of mid-month. After a brief discussion, Mayor Fore advised that the motion has been noted, but no action needs to be taken at this time. The continuing conflict between 2 neighbors on Woodfield Avenue concerning a fence was mentioned by Commissioner Price. One of the residents was at the meeting and advised that a fence post that may be in conflict with the spirit of the ordinance would be removed.

There being no further business or discussion, a motion was made and carried, pursuant to KRS 61.815, to allow for the Commission to hold an Executive Session, pursuant to KRS61.810 (f), to discuss city personnel. When complete, the regular meeting will be adjourned.
