Minutes from the Last City Meeting, June 9

The regular meeting of the City Commission was called to order at 7:30 PM on June 9, 2011 at the meeting room of the Hurstbourne Acres City Hall/Police Department, 1940 S. Hurstbourne Parkway, Louisville, Kentucky, with the following persons present:

Minutes for Meeting on May 12, 2011

Commissioner Hardin made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was then seconded by Commissioner Renninger, and passed without opposition.

Treasurer's Report

Sharon Hollkamp read the treasurer's report for May 2011 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Price made a motion to approve as read, which was seconded by Commissioner Renninger. The motion passed without opposition.

Warrants

The warrants for May 2011 were then presented by Sharon Hollkamp, and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After discussion,

Commissioner Hardin made a motion to approve the warrants as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger which passed unopposed.

Investment Fund/Payroll Changes

In order to streamline the investment and payroll process, Treasurer Hollkamp presented her plan which includes the moving and consolidating of funds and automatic deposit.

Police Report

Police Chief Redman reported on the following:

- 289 coverage hours from 5/12/11 to 6/9/11
- 390 Police/Public interactions
- 1 arrest
- 11 traffic citations
- 23 traffic stops
- 5 reports
- 29 dispatched runs
- 18 suspicious circumstances
- 150 house and business checks

In other news, the Golden Alert system has been initiated by the Hurstbourne Acres Police Department as discussed at last month's meeting. Mayor Fore concurred that our city is sensitive to the needs of older residents. He asked that anyone aware of a resident who could benefit by the Golden Alert program contact him or the Police Department.

Also, the Police Department awaits several returns of grant money. This coming Saturday is the Citywide Yard Sale. "No Parking" signs will be installed, and police will be on hand to help as needed.

Report by Kathleen Owen, Nunnlea President

In a survey that was completed, it was confirmed that the Kentucky State Highway Department owns the ditch in front of Nunnlea and is responsible for its maintenance. It was also mentioned that Nunnlea supports the construction of a sidewalk along Hurstbourne Parkway. However, in checking with the insurance company for Nunnlea, Kentucky Farm Bureau, if our city has the sidewalk installed, which would be on Nunnlea property, we would then assume the liability. Regarding the cleanup after our city meetings, Mayor Fore promised that he and other volunteers would make sure that the table and

chairs are placed back in their positions prior to the meeting.

Attorney's Report

City Attorney John Frith Stewart had nothing new to discuss; however, there was a question about the city's balanced budget ordinance which the attorney's office will clarify. In response to the question of the giving of Christmas bonuses, the finding was that a bonus in general is acceptable, as long as there is no religious connotation associated with the bonus.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Sanitation

Commissioner Price reported that a few residents had experienced pickup problems but Rumpke promptly handled them. It was mentioned that a resident suggested that there be a "junk" pickup day. Commissioner Price recommended to that resident and any resident, that if they have "junk" to be picked up, they should call Rumpke or herself a few days before a regular pickup. Items that might be a problem would be contaminants such as paint, used motor oil, or household chemicals that need specific handling.

Streets & Lights

Commissioner Hardin confirmed that the citywide yard sale is this coming Saturday, 6/11/11, from 8:00 am to 1:00 pm. The same agency as last year will be contacted to be available after the yard sale to pickup any items that residents would like to dispose of that were not sold. Yellow tape is still surrounding the hole next to the stop sign at Woodfield and Haviland as a precaution. It was mentioned that there is a bent light pole across from 9012 Hurstbourne Lane, which should be repaired soon. Finally, there was further discussion about the proposed sidewalk along Hurstbourne Parkway.

Police

Commissioner Renninger reported that Officer Bittle, the 3rd police officer, serves as the city's public information officer. The city awaits funds from the Highway Safety Grant.

OLD BUSINESS

2nd Reading of Ordinance #7

Mayor Fore completed the second reading of Ordinance #7, Series 2011, an ordinance adopting the codification of all ordinances for the City of Hurstbourne Acres, Kentucky. Commissioner Price then made a motion to enact and ordain. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger, and passed without opposition. The ordinance will become effective upon its publication. Copies of the codified city ordinances were delivered to the Commissioners in attendance on CD.

Pay Policy

Mayor Fore clarified that currently, all public officials of the city, except the Police Department employees, are paid in advance for their services. For example, checks given out tonight are for the entire month of June. The employees of our Police Department are paid every two weeks after services are rendered. After further discussion, it was agreed that all employees will receive checks at the end of the month.

Woodfield Dispute

One of the neighbors involved in the dispute was at the meeting. Mayor Fore will accompany him after the meeting to observe the current markers at the properties for further evaluation and resolution.

Budget Ordinance Discussion

Regarding the aforementioned Balanced Budget Ordinance, the recommendation from the City Treasurer was to include another line in the budget ordinance that would essentially balance the budget. The line would reflect a "carry forward transfer" in an amount that equals the difference between budgeted revenue and budgeted expenses. Mayor Fore will review, including whether a revised budget ordinance is needed, requiring a second publication.

Miscellaneous

As a suggestion regarding the maintenance of the ditch in front of Nunlea, resident Ron Walter proposed filling in the ditch to save future mowing expenses.
