### **Minutes for Meeting on February 23, 2012**

After a requested correction to the minutes from Treasurer Hollkamp regarding payroll, Commissioner Hardin made a motion to accept with the change. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price, and passed without opposition.

### **Treasurer's Report**

Sharon Hollkamp read the treasurer's report for February 2012 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Hardin made a motion to accept the report as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger, and passed without opposition.

### **Warrants**

The warrants for February 2012 were presented by Sharon Hollkamp, and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After discussion, Commissioner Kuster made a motion to accept. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price, and passed unopposed.

### **Police Report**

Police Chief Redman reported on the following:

- 198 coverage hours from 2/23/12 to 3/8/12
- 0 arrests
- 0 traffic citation
- 2 reports
- Police/Public contacts approximately 200
- 11 traffic stops
- 13 suspicious persons/situations

It was also mentioned that the Police Dept took possession of a rifle and pistol, which complete the firearms acquisition.

### **Attorney's Report**

Attorney Stewart confirmed that the pursuit of the delinquent taxes from owners of properties in Hurstbourne Acres is ongoing.

### **City Park Gazebo**

At Mayor Fore's request, the discussion of the construction of the Gazebo in the Park was tabled until next month's meeting.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### **Parks**

Commissioner Kuster reported on the following:

- The Easter Egg Hunt will be held on Saturday, April 7, beginning at 11:00 am
- The Port-A-Let will be placed back in the Park in April
- The checking of the water meter has not yet been completed, but will be handled shortly,
- As suggested by Commissioner Hardin, the current flag in the Park will be replaced with a new flag.

### **Sanitation**

As discussed in prior meetings, Commissioner Price had contacted other surrounding cities about their sanitation contracts. 3 of those cities were interested in going forward with establishing a joint contract with Rumpke as a cost cutting measure. More details are to follow. Concerning a question about backdoor service, Commissioner Price was not sure it was working properly. She will get a count of households from Michael Sweeten of those who use that service. Additional information was provided regarding the crosswalk markings for traffic coming in and out of Hurstbourne Circle. This remains an

unresolved issue. The discussion of the potential construction of a sidewalk by the apartments was continued. Commissioner Price presented the proposal to the manager of the apartments who said she has passed it on to her supervisor for further review. Commissioner Price did learn that there is a 16-1/2 ft easement on the apartment side of Blowing Tree. In order to help facilitate a response from the management of the apartment complex, Mayor Fore said he would write a letter advising that the City was proceeding with the sidewalk plans. Operation Bright Side will be held on Saturday, 4/14, beginning at 10:30 am at the entrance to the Park.

### **Streets & Lights**

Commissioner Hardin mentioned a problem with a commercial dumpster shell on Bunsen Way. It has attracted rats and other rodents. In other news, Commissioner Hardin proposed getting a “No Turn on Red” sign installed at the corner of Bunsen & Hurstbourne Parkway by means of petition. This was presented as another solution to the problem of getting in and out of Hurstbourne Circle.

### **Police**

Commissioner Renninger reported that the next Drug Drop-Off program will be held on Saturday, 4/28, on the side of Nunnlea. In other news, the City Commission has reviewed the option of using the recently vacated Nunnlea Annex for use as the Police Department/City Hall. After further consideration, the City is moving forward with the proposal. There would be a 1-year lease beginning 3/1/12. Mayor Fore outlined some of the lease conditions. Commissioner Kuster made a motion to proceed with the signing of the lease. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price, which passed unanimously. Finally, Commissioner Renninger advised that we now have new brochures for the City.

### **Private Investigator**

Mayor Fore recently learned that Commissioner Kuster had personally hired a private investigator to validate Police Chief Redman’s work hours. In addition, the investigator was asked to determine whether there was any business relationship between Mayor Fore and Chief Redman. After Commissioner Kuster was given an opportunity to explain his

actions, both Mayor Fore & Chief Redman advised that they would be taking legal action.

There being no further business or discussion, the meeting was adjourned.
