Grilling Safety

The warm spring weather brings on the grilling season. Grilling safety should start before you even start to cook. To help ensure your grilling plans don't go up in flames, follow these safety tips;

Prepare

The grill by checking for gas leaks and cleaning both the grill surface as well as but also where the drippings collect.

Location, Location, Location

Move your grill away from flammable objects, including the house or an umbrella. Nearly 30% of home grilling fires start on a balcony or open patio.

Flame On

Only use charcoal starter fluid to start a charcoal grill. Never use lighter fluid or any other fire accelerant on an open flame. Gasoline or lighter fluid is a factor in almost one-quarter of the charcoal grill burns seen in emergency rooms.

Adult Supervision Required

Never leave the grill unattended when cooking. Radiating heat from the grill and grease flare-ups can lead to a home fire very quickly if a grill is left unsupervised.

In the Zone

Keep kids and pets away from a hot grill. Maintain a safe zone of at least three feet around the grilling area to prevent children or pets from touching a hot grill.

Keep It Clean

Clean and maintain your grill. Check the valves and hoses for cracks or leaks. Leaks or hose breaks are the leading factor contributing to gas-fueled grill fires.

Enjoy your grilling season and be safe.

The regular meeting of the City Commission was called to order at 7:30 PM on April 11, 2013 at the meeting room of the Hurstbourne Acres City Hall/Police Department, 1916 Hurstbourne Circle, Louisville, Kentucky, with the following persons present;

March 14, 2013 Minutes

After review of the draft copy of the minutes, Commissioner Lynch made a motion to accept as published. The motion, which was seconded by Commissioner Miles, passed unopposed.

Treasurer's Report

Sharon Hollkamp read the treasurer's report for March, 2013 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Renninger made a motion to accept as read. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price and passed without opposition.

Attorney's Report

Stephen Emery advised that more specific information about the violation(s) of the ordinance is required in order to complete the legal action toward the owner of the property on Addington. Concerning the possibility of adding a revenue stream to the City, he mentioned his background with the Kentucky ABC (Alcoholic Beverage Control) Office from his work with other cities that collect a substantial amount of sales regulatory fees. With this background he is in a position to assist our City in the process of generating additional revenue. From a contact by a resident, Commissioner Lynch asked Attorney Emery to check the deed restrictions concerning a former path between 2 houses on Cardwell Way. The resident would like to see this open again for use as a walking or bike path. If this is legally unavailable, the attorney was asked to check for an easement at the end of Cardwell Way that could be utilized for this same purpose.

Police Report

Police Chief Redman reported to the Commission that there were 465 coverage hours from 3/14 to 4/11. During this time, there were no citations or arrests. Our police department has been busy with burglary investigations and surveillance, and responding to increased calls for our presence in the business areas. The apartments and business areas continue to require heavy patrols. Several traffic stops and contacts with numerous individuals have been made. Our emphasis on the correction of driving behavior for residents rather than stricter ticketing continues to be effective. More action remains regarding the foreclosed property on (address withheld). The criminal summons is still unserved on the owner, but the bank is starting to maintain the property.

Warrants

Sharon Hollkamp read the warrants for March, 2013, and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Lynch made a motion to accept as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Miles which passed unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Streets & Lights

Commissioner Lynch advised that LG&E was contacted again to fix a light on Bristol. In other news, the shopping center across the street that includes Wal-Mart has requested a zoning change by Applebee's (right in & right out only). The meeting to discuss this change will be held at 1:00 pm on 4/17 downtown, and the Case # is 18833.

Sanitation

Commissioner Price reported that Operation Brightside will be held this Saturday, 4/13 at 10:30 am, and those participating will meet behind the car wash. She proposed the removal of some sections of the rusted fence bordering our property and the Bullitt Trust property as part of the cleanup. Mayor Fore favored the idea of the fence removal as long as permission is first obtained. Specifically, the City would require authorization in writing from Mr. Couch, the legal representative for the Bullitt Trust Property. Commissioner Lynch suggested that any removal could promote the unwanted parking of vehicles in that area. If approval is granted, Commissioner Price is to confirm what would constitute an acceptable property marker, which was recommended by resident, Brent Hardin. Mayor Fore also expressed his opinion that the removal be done professionally. If not professionally, Commissioner Miles advised that he has bolt cutters that could facilitate the removal. Commissioner Price was asked by Mayor Fore to concentrate the efforts this Saturday in the cleanup of the entrance at Hurstbourne Lane & Taylorsville Road. In other news, from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm on 4/28, the shredding service will be in our City. The electronics pickup by Bluegrass E-Cycle is being rescheduled to later in the year due to a conflict with the City Yard Sale. Finally, Commissioner Price mentioned a complaint she received from a resident about the violation of the noise ordinance, twice in one week, by a waste collection truck servicing the area behind the Taylorhurst Shopping Center. In response, she sent a copy of the ordinance to all of the waste collection service providers who handle Bunsen and Taylorshurst. She also spoke to their respective regional representatives, so all have been suitably informed.

Parks

Commissioner Miles first thanked everyone who expressed their condolences for the passing of his father a couple of weeks ago. In Park news, he advised that the Port-A-Let is back in the park. The City Yard Sale will be held on 5/18. Relative to the yard sale, he confirmed his purchase of smaller, plastic 'no parking' signs for about \$1.30 a piece. This will make it easier to install and remove as needed, and should last for several years. Based on a recommendation from 'Stump Busters', the sand in the playground area of the park will not be tilled as planned. They have a tool that will take care of the issues without the tilling. Commissioner Miles asked whether a decision had been made about the record retention for the City. After Mayor Fore had advised that a decision had been made, but no action yet taken, Commissioner Price mentioned that Attorney Lynch had previously provided her with the retention schedule for the State of Kentucky. This outlines when and which records can be purged from the City's records. It was mentioned that the cost of the mowing contract with 'Stump Busters' will remain the same this year. Dan Kuster has been notified about the need to return the park flag to the City. The Easter Egg Hunt was a success again this year. Around 18 or 19 children participated. Commissioner Miles had contacted the person this past Tuesday about the new playground equipment. She said that everything should be in, and in the hands of the vendor for installation next week. That installer has not yet contacted Commissioner Miles to confirm.

Police

Commissioner Renninger pointed out that our ordinance dealing with door to door salesman and peddlers (Ordinance #7, Series 2012) references an application process and fee, yet the City has no application form available nor does it stipulate the associated fee. To resolve this, Commissioner Renninger has found a copy of the application used by the City of Louisville. She has proposed that we modify it as needed for use by our City, and that we determine the fee amount so that the ordinance can be amended accordingly. After discussion, approval was given to modify the form indicated. Also, it was agreed to set the application fee at \$25. As confirmed by Attorney Emery, the 'no solicitation' signs need to be corrected to include the ordinance number. New signs will be ordered and posted at the 3 city entrances.

NEW/OLD BUSINESS

First Reading of Ad Valorem Tax Ordinance

After discussion and unanimous approval to leave the tax unchanged at \$.14 per \$100 of valuation, Commissioner Price made a motion to have the first reading of Ordinance #1, Series 2013, establishing the Ad Valorem Tax for the upcoming fiscal year. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger and passed without opposition. The reading was then completed by Mayor Fore.

First Reading of Budget Ordinance

With the preliminary numbers approved, Commissioner Renninger made a motion to have the first reading of Ordinance #2, Series 2013, establishing the budget for the upcoming fiscal year. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Miles and passed unopposed. Mayor Fore then completed the reading. He subsequently asked Treasurer Hollkamp to provide the detailed numbers to each commissioner in the areas for which they are responsible to allow for the final discussion and completion of the second reading next month.

ABC Revenue

Mayor Fore said that he has not yet met with his contact from J-Town to obtain information on the process of establishing a 'liquor tax'. However, he has had several discussions with others that have provided additional help. The Mayor said that he needs to obtain a better understanding of the size of the potential revenue stream to the City compared to the cost of establishing an ABC board, director, and legal liability to the City. He promised to provide a full report to the Commission at the meeting next month.

Fence Permit Applications

The Commission reviewed fence permit applications from 2 residents. For resident Terry McAllister, some additional measuring and clarification is needed, but should be completed shortly. The Commission will then notify the city clerk about their decision. The fence permit application from resident Mary Thompson has been approved.

From the Penningtons

The Penningtons had 3 comments for the Commission. First, they wanted to advise that while away in Texas, they did not receive all of their copies of the City Newsletter in spite of providing self addressed envelopes for that purpose. Secondly, they wanted the Commission to be aware that an individual or individuals from the office complex by the Park are feeding the geese. Due to the nuisance and sanitation issues presented by the geese to the City, Police Chief Redman has been instructed to meet with the people in the office buildings to discourage further feeding of the geese. It was also proposed that 'no feeding' signs be posted in the Park. Lastly, they wanted everyone to be aware that Edward Jones is sponsoring a 'meet and greet' opportunity tomorrow to promote their financial services.

There being no further business or discussion during the regular meeting, an Executive Session was called by Mayor Fore, pursuant to KRS 61.810(1)(f), to discuss city personnel. When complete, the regular meeting will be adjourned.
