## SANITATION

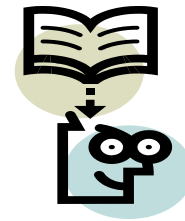

### Household Hazardous Materials

The Household Hazardous Materials collection, HAZ BIN, is a program run by the Louisville Metro Solid Waste Management Department. It provides a safe & convenient way to dispose of unwanted household hazardous materials which are not accepted by Eco-Tech or recycling centers. A list of specific items accepted & refused can be found at [www.louisvilleky.gov/solidwaste/household-hazardous-materials](http://www.louisvilleky.gov/solidwaste/household-hazardous-materials). Their facility is at 7501 Grade Lane; take I-65 to Outer Loop west, exit 127W, go approximately one mile and turn north on Grade Lane. The entrance is located ¼ mile on the right at the end of the driveway. Hours: Only Wednesdays & Saturdays, from 9am to 3pm.

**June 13, 2013 Minutes**

After review of the draft copy of the minutes, Commissioner Lynch made a motion to accept as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger, and passed without opposition.

**Treasurer's Report**

Sharon Hollkamp read the treasurer's report for June, 2013 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Matt Anderson from Edward Jones, the City's Financial Advisor, also reported on the City's investments and answered questions. Commissioner Lynch made a motion to accept as read. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price and passed unopposed.

**Warrants**

Sharon Hollkamp provided an update on the uncollected property taxes discussed in prior meetings. She then read the warrants for June, 2013, and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Renninger made a motion to accept as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Miles which passed unanimously. Sharon Hollkamp confirmed that the city audit from fiscal year July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012 has been completed. Commissioner Miles turned over some bills to Treasurer Hollkamp.

**Police Report**

Police Chief, Chris Redman, reported on the following for the period from June 11 to July 13;

- 212 coverage hours,
- No arrests or reports,
- 7 traffic stops,
- Approximately 320 public/police interactions,
- 11 responses to suspicious circumstances,

After a discussion, approval by Mayor Fore was given to paint the median and install 2 'No U-Turn' signs on Bunsen Way.

### **Attorney's Report**

Regarding the property on (address withheld), Steve Emery advised that an address has been found for the owner. However, because the address is out-of-state, he advised that it was unlikely that a summons could be served successfully. It was reported that Commissioner Price has been in contact with the representative from the Taylorhurst properties concerning handicapped access to the rear of the property. However, no response has yet been received. As a result of a drainage problem on Cardwell Way, with some correspondence reviewed by Attorney Emery, Mayor Fore is meeting with a property owner and the representative from Jefferson County Public Schools on Tuesday, July 16. In an effort to find the City's specific investment ordinance, Mayor Fore said that he would request from John Frith Stewart's office a copy of the City's files. Attorney Emery has made several attempts to get the appropriate files, but without success. Attorney Emery is still waiting for a signed complaint from the City Treasurer, Sharon Hollkamp, or requires whether the proposed complaint needs to be altered (if someone has paid the tax, penalties, interest, costs, and attorney fees) to remove defendants. Finally, the ABC regulatory fees were discussed including confirmation that no city in Jefferson County is charging a regulatory fee

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

#### **Parks**

Commissioner Miles reintroduced the idea of installing a sidewalk on Blowing Tree Rd. Mayor Fore agreed to draft a letter, along with Commissioner Miles, to the management of Camden Apartments. The letter will be reviewed and approved by our attorney before submitting. In other news, it was reported that the water was once again left on in the Park. An update on the upcoming City picnic was provided.

### **Sanitation**

Commissioner Price was advised by MSD that the drainage problem affecting the resident on Blowing Tree will not be resolved until the gravel driveway running from Bunsen to Blowing Tree is addressed. She then proposed a possible solution suggested the resident a 'speed bump' which could redirect the water way from the resident's property. After discussion and approval, Commissioner Lynch said that he would handle the speed bump's installation. This should also deter speeding on Blowing Tree Road. Bluegrass E-Cycle will be in our City on Saturday, 7/13/13, between 9:00 am & noon. The next Book Club meeting is Monday, 7/15. Information regarding the disposal of hazardous household materials will be included in the next newsletter.

### **Streets**

Commissioner Lynch reported on a broken street light on Bunsen Way. In the main subdivision, a street globe was misaligned. Steps have been taken to prevent any future flooding on Hurstbourne Circle. Finally, based on recently published information concerning a city's liability with sidewalks, Mayor Fore has instructed Commissioner Miles to get any and all repairs made to the sidewalks on Bunsen Way.

### **Police**

Commissioner Renninger reported that some peddlers were recently found in the City and asked to leave. Any resident who encounters a peddler without a permit issued by our City should contact our Police Department. With the recent change in Insight to Time Warner Cable, the City's e-mail address has changed. We now control our own e-mail. That information will be included in all future newsletters. Our Police Department has completed multiple checks of the abandoned/vacant house on (address withheld), and it appears that the property is now being consistently maintained. Commissioner Lynch will work on getting new 'No Solicitation' signs which will reflect the appropriate ordinance information. To answer the concerns by the Commission about the healthcare benefits offered to our Police Department employees, Commissioner Renninger and Attorney Emery have developed a healthcare reimbursement allowance up to \$3500.

**NEW/OLD BUSINESS**

**First Reading of Ordinance #3, Series 2013**

The Commission approved the first reading of Ordinance #3, Series 2013 amending Section 2 of Ordinance 5, Series 2012 relating to the compensation of elected city officials (healthcare reimbursement allowance for Police Department employees). Mayor Fore then completed the reading.

**First Reading of Ordinance #4, Series 2013**

After discussion and clarification about the costs and benefits of establishing an ordinance, Commissioner Lynch made a motion to have the first reading of Ordinance #4, Series 2013, an ordinance relating to the regulation of the sale of alcoholic beverages in the City of Hurstbourne Acres. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger and passed unanimously. Attorney Emery then completed the summary reading.

**Ethics Committee**

Mayor Fore explained the duties and responsibilities of the Ethics Committee. After a discussion about the necessity of having a ‘chairperson’ for the committee, resident Terry McAllister volunteered.

**Sublet Services from J-Town**

Mayor Fore met with the mayor of J-town and sent a letter on 7/2. The letter outlined the possible services the City of Hurstbourne Acres would request, including street paving and striping, painting of the median on Bunsen Way, sign installation, salting and snow removal.

**City Hall**

Resident Jeri Heck has offered to sell her house to the City for use as a City Hall. After discussion and a roll call vote, it was decided to leave the City Hall at its current location for now.

There being no further business or discussion, the meeting was adjourned.
