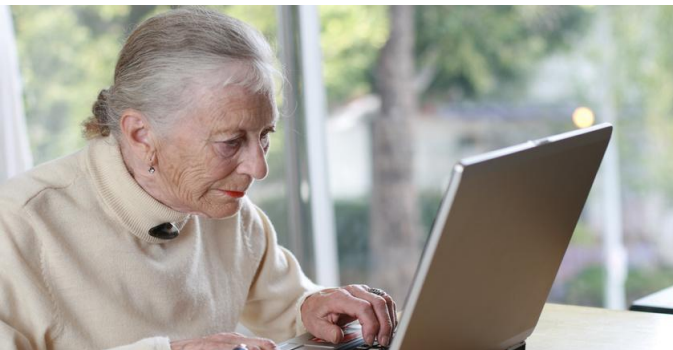

October 10, 2013 Minutes

After review of the draft copy of the minutes, Commissioner Lynch made a motion to accept as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger, and passed without opposition.

Treasurer's Report

In Treasurer Hollkamp's absence, Mayor Fore read the monthly treasurer's report for October, 2013 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After a discussion, Commissioner Lynch made a motion to accept the report as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Miles which passed unanimously.

Warrants

In Treasurer Hollkamp's absence, Mayor Fore read the warrants for October, 2013 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. A motion to accept the warrants was approved by the Commissioner with no opposition.

Police Report

Police Officer Bittle reported on the following;

- 20 House Watches,
- 4 traffic stops,
- 4 warnings,
- 6 motorist assists,
- 5 interagency contacts,
- 1 theft report,
- 1 accident report,
- All businesses checked,

In other news, Officer Bittle attended the men's CIC meeting on November 13. A missing child was located across the street in J-Town, problems from unlocked cars continue as well as theft of catalytic converters in the industrial park.

Attorney's Report

Steve Emery reported that there are still 2 unpaid property tax bills from fiscal year 2012 to 2013, one of which is a property in bankruptcy. Attorney Emery will be appearing at a hearing on the morning of December 11 regarding that bankruptcy. The other tax bill from that same fiscal year has a lien filed against it by our City. A complaint has been prepared, but not yet signed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parks

Commissioner Miles reported that the Port-A-Let has been removed from the park. In addition to the spider infestation in the shed, termite damage has also been found. That will be taken care of in the Spring. He received a complaint about the brush between the apartments and the houses on Wesley. The apartment management will be contacted about getting the brush cleaned up. The sign-ups have been started for the petition for the ABC ordinance (wet vs. dry vote).

Sanitation

Commissioner Price advised that there were 5 participants from our City for Operation Bright Side. She particularly wanted to thank David Ayers who has participated every time our City has been involved. Book Club will be held this coming Monday, November 18, at 3:00 pm. The book, ‘The Little Prince’ will be read for December. The next 3 recycling dates will be November 19, December 3 and December 17.

Streets

Commissioner Lynch reported that several branches have come down from the most recent storms. A hole has developed on Bunsen Way similar to the one problems on Haviland. MSD was contacted and the hole repaired. As a result of the flooding of the ditch in front of Nunnlea, Commissioner Lynch contacted the office of our Metro District Representation, Marilyn Parker, for assistance in resolving that issue. He also advised that the ‘No U-Turn’ signs on Bunsen have been effective, but suggested that more patrolling was needed. The stop signs and lines were supposed to be painted, but the low temperatures have prevented that. More ‘No Solicitation’ signs have been ordered. There were spelling errors on the previous signs which have to be replaced at no cost to the City. The street sign at Blowing Tree and Wesley has once again been stolen. Both the speed bumps on Blowing Tree and Cardwell Way have been effective in reducing speeders.

Police

Commissioner Renninger advised that we continue to watch the vacant homes on Addington. A complaint was made about trees being dumped on Blowing Tree, but the fence post location is not in our City so no action can be taken by us. There is a transmission problem with the Impala, and no money was budgeted for this contingency. Since repairs need to be made, she was asked by the Mayor to obtain estimates.

NEW/OLD BUSINESS

Sidewalk on Blowing Tree

It was reported by Mayor Fore and Commissioner Miles that there are no further developments with regard to getting a sidewalk installed on Blowing Tree.

Opening in Wall at Taylorhurst

Based on the recent survey of residents along Hurstbourne Lane, Mayor Fore advised that the opening will be left as is. However, Commissioner Price asked about previous suggestions to trim the bushes or install security cameras. Before the City takes any action, Mayor Fore will send a formal letter to management at Taylorhurst for approval.

Cat Problem

After a discussion about the City’s cat problem, Mayor Fore agreed to contact ‘Critter Ridders’.

ABC Ordinance

There was a lengthy discussion about the City’s adoption of the ordinance to license and regulate the sale of alcoholic beverages within the City. Liquor Barn representative Roger Leasor outlined his understanding of the law suggesting that our City cannot legally set regulatory fees. More research is underway by our attorney and more information will be provided as the situation develops.

There being no further business or discussion to be conducted at the open portion of the meeting, a closed session was called according to KRS 61.810(1), (c) (“Discussions of proposed or pending litigation against or on behalf of the public agency”) by Mayor Fore, after which the regular meeting will be adjourned.
