How to Report a House Watch


If you are in need of a house watch by the Hurstbourne Acres Police Department here is some tips to follow:

1. Call the police station and leave message (502) 499-2352 an officer will get back to you.

2. Go to the website

It is important that we know who has access and what type of cars they will be driving. We will also give you a call weekly to give you a update on your property so your contact numbers are important to us. We prefer to get our information directly from the homeowner so that we will know all information is correct.

Winter Safety Tips

During this very cold winter months that have been filled with ice, snow and below average temperatures life has been a challenge for everyone. With slippery sidewalks and cold weather can cause a wide range of injuries and illnesses.

Here are some helpful tips for preventing common winter dangers.

1. *Avoid Slipping on Ice.*

Icy, snowy roads and sidewalks make it easy to slip and fall. Make sure to wear shoes with good traction and non-skid soles and stay inside until roads are clear.

2. *Dress Warm.*

Cold temperatures can lead to frostbit and hypothermia (a condition where the body temperature dips too low. Your body temperature should never dip below 95 degrees if it does get medical assistance.

So don't let indoor temperatures go too low and dress in layers. Outside be sure to wear warm socks, a warm coat, hat, gloves and a scarf. In extreme cold temperatures cover all exposed skin.

3. *Fight Wintertime Depression*

Stay in touch with family and neighbors so you can avoid the feeling of loneliness and isolation.

4. *Prepare for Power Outages*

Make sure you have easy access to flashlights and a battery powered radio in case the power goes out. Keep a stockpile of warm blankets. Don't hesitate to ask for help.


5. *Prevent Carbon Monoxide Poisoning*

Using a fireplace, gas heater or lanterns can lead to carbon monoxide poisoning. Ensure your safety by checking the batteries on your carbon monoxide detector and buying an updated one if you need to.

The most important tip to keep in mind during the colder months is to ask for help. If you need to clear your property of snow and ice, ask a family member or neighbor or hire a professional.

December 12, 2013 Minutes

After review of the draft copy of the minutes, Commissioner Lynch made a motion to accept as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Miles, and passed without opposition.

Treasurer's Report

Sharon Hollkamp read the monthly treasurer's report for December, 2013 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After a discussion, Commissioner Lynch made a motion to accept the report as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price which passed unanimously.

Warrants

Sharon Hollkamp read the warrants for December, 2013 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. A motion to accept the warrants was made by Commissioner Lynch, and seconded by Commissioner Price. The motion passed unopposed.

Police Report

Police Officer Bittle reported on the following;

- 8 House Watches,
- 280 checks,
- 5 traffic stops,
- 5 warnings,
- 5 motorist assists,
- 1 accident report,
- 15 contacts with outside agencies,
- City now on line with the Incident Report

System

Attorney's Report

Steve Emery reported that there are legislative proposals being drafted by the liquor industry aimed at trying to restrict the time in which a regulatory license fee can be adopted after the discontinuance of prohibition. The proposal would cap the fee at 3% and include a period of time after which the fees would be discontinued. There is also a proposal that would require the expiration date of state licenses to coincide with those of cities and counties.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parks

Commissioner Miles reported that the manager at the apartments with whom he has met to discuss the construction of the sidewalk on Blowing Tree is still waiting to hear back from upper management. More information will be provided once a decision has been made.

Sanitation

Commissioner Price advised that the book club meets this Monday, 1/13. Also, as coordinator for sending flowers from the City in the case of the death of a resident, she is not always aware of the situation. She would like to be contacted so that no one is forgotten. Finally, she has not yet heard back from Eco-Tech regarding fee changes resulting from proposed modifications to the weekly services.

Streets

Commissioner Lynch reported on the following;

-the cover for a water meter behind the shopping center is missing again, and Louisville Water Company has been contacted,

-the orange cone that was located over the hole on Bunsen was dragged, so the cone had to be reset, and remains a dangerous situation,

-stop sign on Woodfield and Hurstbourne Lane has been temporarily repaired,

-it was confirmed that the painted payment marks at stop signs will definitely be redone this year,

-trees along Bristol need to be trimmed,

-sections of the sidewalk along Bunsen need repairing.

Police

Commissioner Renninger advised that as of this date, the city streets have been treated twice this Winter. She stated that some residents are still not moving their cars from city streets for proper snow removal. Commissioner Renninger remains busy with ABC licensing issues. It was brought to her attention that some residents are not locking their doors. Finally, she mentioned that some equipment (older radios) the City no longer uses could be sold. A potential buyer would be some Fire Departments, for example, who still use those types of radios. Attorney Emery outlined the procedure, which once completed, can allow for the preparation of a 'Declaration of Surplus.'

NEW/OLD BUSINESS

2nd Reading of Ordinance #5, Series 2013

The Commission approved the second reading of Ordinance #5, Series 2013, amending Ordinance #4, Series 2013 related to the regulation of Alcoholic Beverages in the City of Hurstbourne Acres. The reading was then completed by Attorney Emery. Commissioner Miles made a motion to enact and ordain the ordinance which was seconded by Commissioner Renninger. A roll call vote was requested by Mayor Fore. In a question from Commissioner Price, Commissioner Renninger answered that the approximate annual income stream from the ABC licensing would be about \$10,000. Mayor Fore and Commissioners Miles, Renninger and Lynch voted 'Yes' with Commissioner Price voting 'No'. The ordinance passed and will be effective upon its publication. Mayor Fore agreed to include in the city newsletter an explanation of the ordinance.

Audit Report 6/30/13

Mayor Fore reported that the City received a clean audit report. He did however mention that the last page of the audit revealed an internal control issue regarding the handling of warrants and the City's bank accounts. Concerning the warrants, Mayor Fore has spoken with the Treasurer, and noted that the City does not have a formalized approval procedure though that can be created, if required. For the bank accounts, Mayor Fore still needs to discuss with the auditors. The Mayor decided to put in place a specific oversight on the bank reconciliations and where the bank statements go.

Facebook Page

After a brief discussion, approval was given by the Commission to create a Facebook page for the City. City newsletter editor, Troy Eskridge, volunteered to setup the page for a trial period of 3 months.

Police Chief Returning 1/13

Police Chief Redman has been off duty as a result of an injury to his foot. He will be returning to work on Monday, 1/13.

Miscellaneous

Mayor Fore reminded everyone that the deadline for filing for the position of Commissioner or Mayor is 8/12/14. He indicated that he will not be running again for Mayor or Commissioner. In a discussion of the ethics forms, it was agreed that no changes are needed.

There being no further business or discussion to be conducted at the open portion of the meeting, a closed session was called by Mayor Fore, after which the regular meeting will be adjourned.
