

Group activities such as bowling, or bridge and other various card games keep your mind and memory active and the interaction with others is also good for your mind.



January 9, 2014 Minutes

After review of the draft copy of the minutes, it was noted that attendee, Brent Renninger, should have been listed as 'resident'. Commissioner Price then made a motion to accept as published with the correction. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger, and passed with Commissioner Lynch opposed.

Treasurer's Report

Sharon Hollkamp read the monthly treasurer's report for January, 2014 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After a discussion, Commissioner Lynch made a motion to accept the report as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price which passed unanimously.

Warrants

Sharon Hollkamp read the warrants for January, 2014 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. A motion to accept the warrants was made by Commissioner Lynch, and seconded by Commissioner Renninger. The motion passed unopposed.

Police Report

Police Chief Bittle reported the following;

- 200 house watches/checks,
- Daily checks of retail establishments,
- 3 traffic stops,
- 3 warnings,
- Multiple motorist assists during snow storms,
- 4 traffic accidents,
- All ABC licenses have been issued, and answered questions from retailers regarding the same,
- 2 suspicious persons,
- 2 panhandler complaints.

Attorney's Report

Steve Emery reported that the 'Declaration of Surplus' has been prepared for vote by the Commission. This is for consideration by the Commission of the disposal of certain personal property of our Police Department. After the reading of the 'Written Determination For Disposal of Personal Property' by Mayor Fore, all commissioners present voted in favor of the proposed disposal. In other news, the attorney has also prepared information regarding the recent requests from Regal Car Wash.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parks

Due to Commissioner Miles absence, there was no report this month.

Sanitation

Commissioner Price advised that on Saturday, February 1, she picked up trash along the brick wall. She also reported that she along with Commissioner Lynch have been in touch with the office of Metro District Representative Marilyn Parker to get an update on the construction of a sidewalk extension from 'Liquor Barn' to Bunsen Way.

Streets

Commissioner Lynch reported on the following;

- down wire on Cardwell Way,
- Police Chief Bittle discovered that the cover for a water meter behind the shopping center was missing again,
- 2 street light covers were reported as misaligned/crooked,
- one of the two 'No U-Turn' signs on Bunsen had been knocked down, which will be reinstalled shortly,
- tree had fallen across the sidewalk on Bunsen, and Commissioner Lynch had obtained the assistance from a 'stranded' motorist in clearing the sidewalk.

Police

Commissioner Renninger advised that all of the ABC license fees have been collected and all certificates issued, good until midnight, June 30, 2014. The license fees will generate \$9000 annually. Louisville Metro Government has been contacted as a reminder that the ABC licensing fees are now being paid to the City of Hurstbourne Acres. She has been working with Dirt Works prior to snow accumulation predictions, reminding all residents through the newsletter to move their vehicles from the streets. Some residents have been contacted in person requesting that their vehicles be temporarily relocated to allow the snow plow to do its job. Lastly, another grant from the Kentucky League of Cities has been approved.

NEW/OLD BUSINESS

New Police Chief

Mayor Fore provided some additional information regarding the suspension of former Police Chief Chris Redman, and the promotion of Rusty Bittle to position of Police Chief of Hurstbourne Acres.

Regal Car Wash

Attorney Steve Emery provided information concerning the request from Regal Car Wash to remove all deed restrictions. After the initial discussion, the City Clerk was instructed to have a 'Public Notice' published in the Courier-Journal regarding the discussion and determination of action by the Commission at next month's meeting.

Facebook Page

A Facebook page for the City has been setup by Troy Eskridge, newsletter editor, under 'The Community of Hurstbourne Acres'. All residents are encouraged to check out and join the community.

Josh Schneider

A candidate for District Court Judge, Josh Schneider, outlined his background and qualifications for the position and answered questions.

There being no further business or discussion to be conducted at the open portion of the meeting, the Commission went into executive session pursuant to KRS 61.810 (c), to discuss proposed or pending litigation against the City. After the executive session was concluded, the regular meeting was resumed and no action was taken. Thereafter, the meeting was adjourned.
