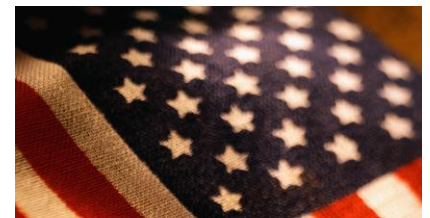

Whether it is for a weekend or the entire season you can contact your Police Department and we will be glad to watch your house. We walk around the house once a day shaking doors and looking in windows. On Sunday's we will call you just to let you know everything is okay. Occasionally people will forget to cancel their paper or mail. We will contact you or your emergency contact to get the matter resolved. Getting mail put on hold now is very simple. It can be done online at WWW.USPS.com. No need to go to the post office. Putting in a house watch request is easy. Our forms are located on the City Website, www.hurstbourneacres.org in the police section, forms.

You can also call us at the Police Department and request that one be brought to you, or be picked up at your house if you print them off the computer. It really helps us a lot if you take the time and fill out the form. It provides us with very pertinent information about your house, such as who has access to it, what vehicles will be on property etc... Every now and again someone will tell us their neighbor is out of town and want us to keep an eye out. We are glad to do that, but it puts us at a disadvantage if we find something out of place, we have no contact information. It is also a safety concern for all of our officers. When you arrive back home we will provide you with a written report of the dates and times the house was checked.

September 18, 2014 Minutes

After review of the draft copy of the minutes, Commissioner Renninger made a motion to accept as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price and passed unopposed.

Treasurer's Report

Sharon Hollkamp read the monthly treasurer's report for September, 2014 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After a discussion, Commissioner Price made a motion to accept as reported. Commissioner Renninger seconded the motion which then passed unanimously.

Warrants

Sharon Hollkamp read the monthly warrants report for September, 2014 and copies were made available for all attendees. After a discussion, Commissioner Renninger made a motion to accept as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Miles and passed without opposition.

Attorney's Report

In Attorney Emery's absence, his representative, Andrew Howell, had nothing new about which to report.

Police Report

Police Chief Bittle reported the following;

- 4 Housewatches completed (checked daily, owners notified)
- Golden Watch residents being checked weekly,
- Businesses being checked daily,
- 9 traffic stops,
- 3 citations,
- 6 verbal warnings,
- 0 reports,
- 6 inter-agency contacts (LMPD/JPD),
- 4 dispatched runs,
- Worked with Nunnlea House on Arts Fair (assisted with disabled person who was having an episode),
- Assisted with storm damage (a letter from Nunnlea expressing their appreciation for the help provided by Chief Bittle and Officer Holston during the storm the weekend of the Arts Fair was sent to the City),
- Process began of emptying out the property room. All items have been inventoried, and court orders have been prepared to submit to Circuit Court Judge/Commonwealth Attorney,
- Assisted Enterprise with the recovery of a car,
- Sgt. Moore assisted Deans Pet Store with a dispute over stolen puppies,
- An individual was reported at the corner of Hurstbourne Parkway and Bunsen Way with a sign containing a religious message. The investigation determined that there was no impact on traffic, and the individual kept moving around to different parts of the intersection for which LMPD is responsible.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parks

Commissioner Miles reported that the Port-A-Let will be removed from the park for the winter by the end of this month.

Sanitation

Commissioner Price advised that E-Cycle will be returning to our City on Saturday, October 18. Resident Terry McAllister, along with Commissioner Price, will be there to assist anyone needing help getting items out of their car. Resident Donna Nichols has offered to allow residents who can't make it that day to store their items in her garage.

Regarding shredding service about which several residents have asked, the company who has provided that for the City in the past could not confirm a date. However, they will be at Our Lady of Lourdes on Saturday morning, November 1.

Streets

Commissioner Lynch reported that there have been street light problems on Wesley Avenue and Blowing Tree Road. Lights are out or sensors not working properly. Several calls have been made to LG&E who has advised that repair of lights is contracted out and could take 7 to 10 days to fix. Commissioner Lynch asked if Mayor Fore would write a letter to LG&E expressing our concerns about these new problems and the still unresolved problems with lights elsewhere in the City. Mayor Fore said that he would be happy to make that contact.

A drain next to the new restaurant, BoomBozz, on Bunsen was not working properly. Since the City recently paid \$100 to have Bunsen cleaned, MSD was contacted to get it repaired. Commissioner Lynch himself has already shoveled debris out around the drain and in the hole. It is believed that the problem is in the process of being resolved.

Several companies have been contacted about sealcoating our City streets. Two bids have been provided, one for \$29,530 and one for \$34,750. Mayor Fore asked Commissioner Lynch to get more specific information from one of the vendors about effectiveness of the sealcoating. The issue will then be further discussed at the meeting in November.

Finally, Commissioner Lynch advised that there is another homeless person walking around behind his home. Police Chief Bittle was dispatched to checkout the situation.

Police

Commissioner Renninger mentioned that in the Kentucky Law Enforcement magazine, Police Chief Bittle was featured in an article about new police chiefs. In other news, she has written a letter to Nunnlea outlining needed repairs to the buildings. A letter of acknowledgement has been received stating that the board of directors has discussed the list at length. Commissioner Lynch has since installed a new smoke detector. Repairs to the steps and the replacement of a storm door is forthcoming. The other items on the list will be addressed when time and finances permit.

The City has learned that the orthodontist at the corner of Hurstbourne Parkway and Hurstbourne Lane is moving to Hikes Point. Because of how that property is zoned (commercial/residential), it was recommended that the City be vigilant about who becomes the new owner and how that property will be used. There is another property on Taylorsville Road that needs to be watched for a possible unacceptable use. Commissioner Renninger confirmed that the property at 1803 Addington Avenue is being refurbished for resale.

Finally, as was mentioned earlier, Blowing Tree Road is 'dark'. Commissioner Renninger talked with Officer Holston about this. Patrols will be appropriate until LG&E fixes the lights.

First Leaf Pickup

The first leaf pickup in the City will be the weekend of October 25. Commissioner Price reminded everyone that plastic bags can still be used for leaves until January 1, 2015.

Another Speed Bump on Blowing Tree Road?

Due to the change in the status of the Alex R Kennedy Road to an elementary school beginning in 2015, it was suggested that a representative from JCPS be invited to the meeting to discuss the change. In particular, the City wants to determine whether an access road onto Blowing Tree Road will be constructed, or whether another speed bump to slow down additional traffic would be needed.

Snow Removal Contract

Commissioner Renninger has been working with Mayor Fore to get a new contract signed. Mayor Fore advised that our current vendor is considering retiring from the business. The City has obtained other quotes/bids to provide snow removal service. More information will be provided at next month's meeting.

There being no further business or discussion, the meeting was adjourned.
