I have worked numerous cases over the years where this has happened and the homeowner is completely unaware until after the fact. Solicitors also start coming out when the weather turns nice. If you are contacted by a door to door solicitor, please contact the police department immediately. Solicitors are required to have the proper permits before working in Hurstbourne Acres and we would like to check them out to make sure they are legitimate.

Schools will also begin having their Spring Breaks soon. If you will be travelling out of town please take advantage of the House Watch Program so we can keep an eye on your property while you are away. Please contact the police department if you have any questions about the program.

The regular meeting of the City Commission was called to order at 6:30 PM on February 9, 2017 at the meeting room of the Hurstbourne Acres City Hall/Police Department, 1916 Hurstbourne Circle, Louisville, Kentucky, with the following persons present;

January 12, 2017 Minutes

Commissioner Nichols made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger and carried unopposed.

Treasurer's Report

Sharon Hollkamp read the treasurer's report for January, 2017 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Following the discussion, Commissioner McAllister made a motion to accept as reported. Commissioner Renninger seconded the motion which then carried unanimously.

Warrants

Sharon Hollkamp read the warrants for January, 2017 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After a discussion, Commissioner Renninger made a motion to accept as reported. Commissioner Nichols seconded the motion which carried with no opposing vote.

Attorney's Report

Andrew Howell said that he would complete the first reading of the amended garage ordinance when it is addressed later in the meeting. Regarding the Blowing Tree Road sidewalk project, he had no further information to provide. However, Commissioner McAllister said he does have an update to share when it comes up later on the meeting agenda.

Police Chief Griffin reported the following for January, 2017;

- Chief Griffin attended the quarterly law enforcement leaders meeting,
- Officer Phelps completed the field training program,
- All Golden Watch residents checked on weekly,
- All businesses in the shopping centers checked on daily,
- Explorer and Taurus are in good working order.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parks

In Commissioner Eskridge's absence, Commissioner McAllister reported that the City is in the process of getting new chains for the playground swings. In other news, the date for the Easter Egg Hunt this year has been set for April 15. Also, both Commissioner Eskridge and McAllister are working on the Brightside cleanup program which will be held on April 22. A representative from the Brightside organization will be at next month's meeting.

Sanitation

Commissioner McAllister reported that he contacted another surveyor since the last meeting. After reviewing all of the potential surveyors, he contracted with Cardinal Surveying for the sidewalk project on Blowing Tree Road for a price of \$3000. The survey is scheduled to begin in about 3 weeks. He also noted that in

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order to get the grant money from Louisville Metro, someone in our City needs to be certified through the neighborhood development fund training program. Commissioner McAllister said that he would complete the required training. In other news, he asked when the audit for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016 would be available. Treasurer Hollkamp advised that the auditor has had all of the pertinent information from the City since August and will contact them. It was also noted by Commissioner McAllister that one of the speed bump signs on Hurstbourne Lane is missing and needs to be replaced. Lastly, he again brought up the idea of having the City complete a formal ethics certification program offered by the Kentucky League of Cities. Following a discussion, it was decided that the benefits to the City would not justify the expense, so no action was taken.

Roads

Commissioner Nichols reported to the Commission that the price for a new Police Department sign located on the corner of Hurstbourne Parkway and Hurstbourne Circle would be \$112.50. The sign would match the style of other City signs and would be the same size as the current one. The consensus of the Commission was that the sign should be bigger. In order to give the commissioners more time to review the situation, further discussion was tabled until next month's meeting. Concerning the painting of the median on Bunsen Parkway discussed at last month's meeting, Commissioner Nichols called Louisville Metro who sent the request to the Works Department who then sent it to the Technical Review Department. After a discussion, Commissioner Nichols said that she would try and call the Works Department directly. Regarding the repainting of the light poles, Mayor Fore confirmed that he is still working with his contacts. Lastly, after a discussion about how the new newsletter editor was chosen, Mayor Fore agreed that in the future, that decision will be made by the Commission as a whole, and that residents of the City will be offered the opportunity to apply for the position.

Police

Commissioner Renninger had nothing more to report than what had already been outlined by Police Chief Griffin earlier in the meeting.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS

Old Hurstbourne Lane Property

In the past, the Commission informally agreed to look at homes in the City that go up or sale as a potentially more favorable location for a City Hall/ Police Department. Both Mayor Fore and Commissioner Renninger looked at the property recently and expressed their opinions about what it would take to buy and then convert the home on Hurstbourne Lane to a City Hall. Subsequent to the discussion, a decision was made against further consideration.

First Reading of Amended Garage Ordinance

Attorney Andrew Howell completed the first reading of Ordinance #1, Series 2017, amending garage Ordinance #5, Series 2003.

There being no further business or discussion, the meeting was adjourned.
