Police

I hope that everyone had a Merry Christmas and a safe and joyous holiday season. As we begin the New Year, I wanted to take this opportunity to remind you of some of the services that your Police Department offers.

The House Watch program is available to all of our residents who will be away from home for a period of time. During the period you are away from home, a Police Officer will check on your residence during each shift, and at least once per day, each door will be physically checked and each window will be looked at.

The Golden Watch program is available for our senior residents. Golden Watch residents will be contacted each week to see if they need assistance with any issues or concerns.

We have had a few reports lately of vehicles being tampered with on Bristol and on Wesley. The incidents are occurring overnight and the suspects appear to be wearing hoodies. Make sure that you lock your vehicles when you leave them and also make sure that you do not leave items in your vehicle in plain sight. These thieves typically will look for unlocked doors and usually will not break into a locked vehicle unless there are items such as backpacks, purses, or other valuables, that are visible through the windows. You as the residents of Hurstbourne Acres are more familiar with things that are out of the ordinary and we would appreciate any assistance you can give us in keeping our community safe.

The regular meeting of the City Commission was called to order at 7:00 PM on December 14, 2017 at the meeting room of the Hurstbourne Acres City Hall/Police Department, 1916 Hurstbourne Circle, Louisville, Kentucky, with the following persons present;

November 9, 2017 Minutes

Commissioner Nichols made a motion to accept as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Eskridge and carried without opposition.

Treasurer's Report

Sharon Hollkamp read the report for November, 2017 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After a discussion, Commissioner Eskridge made a motion to accept the report as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger which carried unanimously.

Warrants

Sharon Hollkamp read the warrants for November, 2017 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. A motion to accept the warrants as outlined was made by Commissioner McAllister and seconded by Commissioner Renninger. The motion carried unopposed

Police Report

Police Chief Griffin reported on the following for November, 2017;

November, 2017 Highlights;

- All officers completed monthly KLC recommended training,
- The 3 offense reports were for a recovery of a stolen vehicle on Hurstbourne Parkway, theft of a passport at East Chase Apartments, and a burglary in the Meadows Apartment Homes,
- The directed patrol was for a traffic complaint at Hurstbourne Parkway and Hurstbourne Circle. Police Chief Griffin provided a detailed explanation of his traffic survey. The conclusion was that a police presence has little or no effect on delays entering or leaving Hurstbourne Circle. Enforcement actions to alleviate the problem would not be effective and may even be detrimental to the situation.
- All Golden Watch residents checked on weekly,
- All businesses in shopping centers checked on daily,
- Explorer and Taurus are in good working order.

Attorney's Report

Steve Emery deferred comment, if needed, on the Blowing Tree Road sidewalk project until Commissioner McAllister's report. Regarding the playground bid process, he recommended proceeding with the publication for bid in the Courier Journal. The city clerk advised that he would handle for the upcoming January meeting.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parks

Commissioner Eskridge reported that recent storms required the complete removal of 2 trees in the Park. Also removed was the sumac around the pine trees on the berm. In a question from Treasurer Hollkamp, Commissioner Eskridge said that he would obtain Certificates of Insurance from those vendors involved. Attorney Emery requested that those Certificates of Insurance list Hurstbourne Acres as an 'Additional Insured'. The holiday party is this Saturday, December 16, from 2:00 to 5:00 pm. Heitzman Bakery and Deli is catering. There will be pictures with Santa, and a food and toy drive.

Sanitation

Commissioner McAllister has been in contact with Greg at Eco-Tech concerning the observed problem with recycling being emptied in the same truck as regular waste. A proposed solution would be to have separate pickup days for regular sanitation and recycling. He will present this to Eco-Tech and report back at the meeting in January. Commissioner McAllister met with the Meadows Apartment Homes management and their attorney today to discuss the sidewalk project. A copy of the recent survey by the City will be sent to them to review and help assuage their concerns to allow the project to move forward. Regarding the shrubs on Hurstbourne Circle that represent a safety issue, Commissioner McAllister stated that he has talked with all of the residents on the Circle but one. The apparent solution would be to remove the shrubs completely to which Kathleen at Nunnlea is opposed. Mayor Fore asked Commissioner McAllister to draft a formal letter to Nunnlea outlining the safety hazard and requesting that the shrubs be removed. He said that he will manuscript a letter and forward to Mayor Fore for his review before sending. Lastly, Commissioner McAllister requested that a formal decision be made concerning whether the City should consider purchasing the house at 9108 Hurstbourne Lane. The purpose would be for use as a City Hall/Police Department.

Sanitation continued

After a brief discussion, Mayor Fore, Commissioner Renninger and Commissioner Eskridge were opposed, and Commissioners Nichols and McAllister were in favor. As a result, the issue was dropped.

Streets

Commissioner Nichols advised the reason the 3 pole lights at Taylorsville Road and Hurstbourne Lane have been out was due to a faulty transformer. Also, it was determined that the problem with the light shining on the City entrance sign at Hurstbourne Lane and Taylorsville Road was an LG&E issue (electricity was not flowing to the light). Lastly, the problem with the light to the City entrance sign on Cardwell Way was the result of damage by an unknown source. Commissioner Nichols said that she would call Outdoor Lighting to repair.

Police

Commissioner Renninger advised that Liquor Barn has changed ownership (new owners are an American company) and the City is currently updating their ABC. In other news, it was reported that the City has received \$1500 in grant money from KLC for the Park. Recently, Officer Mills has been responsible for the recovery of 3 stolen vehicles. Mayor Fore recommended that he receive a letter of commendation from the City. Lastly, she stated that items were stolen from an unlocked vehicle at Addington Avenue and Bristol Avenue.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS

Satellite Dishes

Mayor Fore was advised by Commissioner Renninger that there was no update concerning the satellite dish situation on Cardwell Way.

Auditor

In answer to a question from Mayor Fore, Treasurer Hollkamp advised that the auditor has all of the information from the City to complete the audit for the period from July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017. After the first of the year, the City will be looking for a new auditor.

Newsletter Editor

Mayor Fore advised that he has a resume from 1 candidate for newsletter editor. He will be asking the other 2 candidates to submit their resumes for review. A decision will be made at the January meeting.

There being no further business or discussion, the meeting was adjourned.
