July 11, 2019 Minutes

Commissioner Nichols made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Eskridge and carried without opposition.

Treasurer's Report

Mayor McAllister read the treasurer's report for July, 2019. Commissioner Eskridge made a motion to approve, and was seconded by Commissioner Nichols. The motion carried unopposed.

Warrants

Mayor McAllister read the warrants for July, 2019. Commissioner Eskridge made a motion to accept as read. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Nichols and carried unanimously.

July Highlights

- All officers completed Kentucky League of Cities recommended monthly training.
- The 3 offense reports were for theft from Pier One Imports, a theft from Shoe Carnival and a criminal possession of a forged instrument at Speedway.
- Officer Stivers completed her annual 40 hour in-service training.
- Chief Griffin and Lieutenant Flowers attended the quarterly local law enforcement leaders meeting.
- All Golden Watch residents were checked on weekly.
- All businesses in shopping centers were checked on daily.
- Explorer and Taurus are in good working order.

Franchise Request

Brian Augustine from MCImetro Access Transmission Services Corp., D/B/A Verizon Access Transmission Services, has requested a 20 year non-exclusive franchise agreement for a communications system within the city limits of Hurstbourne Acres. This is in reference to Hurstbourne Acres City Ordinance #3, Series 2018. Due to the length of the municipal order that needs to be read before the resolution can be approved, and no summary form, the vote was postponed until the next meeting. Mayor McAllister said that he would discuss with the other two commissioners unavailable tonight and contact Mr. Augustine to provide him with a status update.

Attorney's Report

Attorney Emery advised that he does not have an update to the two unresolved issues; the sidewalk project on Blowing Tree Road, and the 'open records' documentation request for the group home.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Streets and Lighting

Commissioner Nichols learned that there is a problem with a grate (MSD) on Caldwell Way that was discovered by Hall Paving. She is working to resolve this.

Also, during the paving of the city streets, Commissioner Nichols determined that Bunsen Way is our City's responsibility. Following a discussion, Commissioner Nichols was asked to get the cost to patch existing pot holes, and the cost to pave the section of Bunsen Way that requires it (not all of Bunsen Way needs repaving).

Parks

Commissioner Eskridge announced that the date for the City picnic this year will be September 29. One detail provided was that the food will once again be catered by Heitzman's. More information will be available at next month's meeting.

Lastly, the additional mulch has been installed in the playground area. That part of the Park is open once again and ready to go.

Police

In Commissioner Renninger's absence, there was no report.

Sanitation

In Commissioner Bohnenkamp's absence, there was no report.

Old/New Business**Audit**

Mayor McAllister stated that he has been in touch with an auditor to replace the one the City currently uses. However, he still needs to discuss further with Treasurer Hollkamp.

Investment Service Provider

Our City currently uses Edward Jones exclusively for investments. Mayor McAllister proposed that the City change our service provider to the Kentucky League of Cities pool. After a lengthy discussion, Commissioner Nichols made a motion to move investments from Edward Jones to the KLC pool, subject to approval from Treasurer Hollkamp. Commissioner Eskridge seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

There being no further business or discussion, the meeting was adjourned.
